

Programming Director at Small World Music

Kristyn is a Toronto based, self-taught producer and arts administrator with over two decades of experience creating spaces for music and expression. From her early start in the vibrant techno scene of the late 90s, she has sought to create fun, liminal, and meaningful events, bringing audiences together to enjoy music from around the globe. She has worked as administrator and bookkeeper at Toronto's iconic Lula Lounge from 2015 to 2020. Since 2012, she has worked with Uma Nota Culture in a variety of roles, including her ongoing role as marketing and managing director. She brings many years of organizational understanding to Uma Nota.

Moudy Schricker

Founder of Link Music Lab

Mahmood Schricker is a musician, producer and founder of Link Music Lab, which supports the promotion and creation of Iranian-Canadian music through genre-crossing collaborations and innovative series like Polotechnics and Experimental Link Series. As a Canadian-Iranian born of Austrian heritage, Schricker unites elements of the different worlds he is part of.

He has transformed the setar into an electronic instrument to expand the possibilities for Persian music to integrate minimal ambient and dub sounds with Persian melodies.





Preparing for a live music performance involves understanding the venue type, from intimate pop-ups and bars to mid-sized auditoriums, festivals, and stadiums, each requiring tailored strategies for setup and sound. This session will provide the tools to create a clear stage plot and tech rider, specifying equipment, inputs, monitors, and lighting needs, are crucial for smooth coordination. We will hear from local event organizers and their take on best practices for artists.

Rory McLeod

Artistic Director of Xenia Concerts

Rory McLeod is a musician, entrepreneur, and concert designer who takes joy in creating authentic human connections through shared musical experiences. As Executive and Artistic Director of Xenia Concerts, he works with a variety of stakeholders in the disability and neurodiversity community, presenting partners, and performing artists to co-create concert experiences that are inclusive for people who face social and systemic barriers to inclusion. Determined to widen the circle of inclusion in the performing arts, Rory is currently pursuing his Master's in Inclusive Design at OCAD University. Rory is also the founder and Co-director of Pocket Concerts, an organization that presents intimate concert experiences in alternative venues all over the GTA.

As the founder of Andrew Kwan Artists Management Inc., he has built an esteemed roster of Grammynominated and JUNO-winning artists, producing over 100 concerts and earning multiple "Agent of the Year" awards. Kwan's passion for arts education led him to help develop Centennial College's Music Industry Arts and Performance Program, where he served as Advisory Chair.

Ahmed Moneka

Moneka Arabic Jazz - Incubator Alumni

Ahmed Moneka arrived in Toronto from Baghdad five years ago and has since collaborated with many artistic institutions including the Canadian Opera Company, Tarragon Theatre, Aga Khan Museum, Tafelmusik, Driftwood Theatre Group, Toronto Jazz Festival, Koerner Hall, Modern Times Stage, Jabari Dance Theatre, Toronto Laboratory Theatre, Theatre Centre, and TRIA Theatre. He is one of the founders of the band Moskitto Bar and is the creator and leader of Moneka Arabic Jazz – a 2019 Stingray Rising Stars Winner at the Toronto Jazz Festival. He joined KUNÉ in 2020.

She graduated from University of Aleppo-Syria Fine Arts Faculty in 2014, specializing in Visual Communications. Leen started her musical career in 2011 as a vocalist with various local Arabic music bands in Syria, in different styles such as flamenco, classic and rock fusion.
